VI. Discuss And Consider Approval Of Meeting Minutes

VII. Welcome New Committee Members (Kimberly Danesi, 15 Minutes)

Mrs. Kimberly Danesi welcomed Virgie Greb, Bob Bullwinkel, Karla Klay, Sharon Tirpak, and Kyle Clark as the newest members of the Beach Maintenance Advisory Committee. The committee members went around the table introducing themselves and their interests.

VIII. Update On Environmental Coordinator Projects (Elizabeth Schneider, 20 Minutes)

Miss. Elizabeth Schneider, the Park Board's Environmental Coordinator, updated the committee on the environmental initiatives undertaken in 2022 and expected timelines for the projects moving into 2023. Miss. Schneider briefed the group on the Volunteer Beach Cleanups, Free Trash Bag Program, Galveston Beach Ambassador Program, Business Beach Ambassador Program, and Women in Coastal Science Series.

IX. Update On Beach Projects (Sheryl Rozier, 20 Minutes)

Mrs. Sheryl Rozier, the Park Board's Project Manager, updated the committee on the beach projects expected in the fall of 2022 and moving into 2023. The nourishment project for the beachfront of Dellanera RV Park will be finished by the end of February and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is expected to contract the Babe's Beach BUDM nourishment project out early in 2023. Mrs. Rozier briefed the committee that the engineering design and plans are being contracted out for a nourishment project extending from where the Dellanera nourishment project ends up to the State Park.

X. Update On The Seaweed Permit Renewal (Kimberly Danesi, 20 Minutes)

The Park Board of Trustees holds a permit with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers to relocate sargassum in times of extreme inundation. This 5-year permit is up for renewal, and Mrs. Kimberly Danesi briefed the committee on the status of the permit renewal process. The Park Board has submitted an application to the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers for this renewal.

XI. 2022-2023 Committee Work Plan (Kimberly Danesi, 10 Minutes)

Mrs. Kimberly Danesi confirmed the committee is on track with the 2022-2023 committee work plan. Mrs. Danesi briefed the new committee members on the purpose of the work plan.

Agenda Item: Recognition of a ‘Friend of Galveston Beaches’

Background: The Beach Maintenance Advisory Committee Chair, Jason Worthen, brought forth the concept of recognizing Galveston citizens who are positively impacting the environment of Galveston Island. Moving forward, staff will bring forth a ‘Friend of Galveston Beaches’ to recognize at BMAC meetings.

Agenda Item: Presentation On City of Galveston Beach Survey (APTIM Representative, 20 Minutes)

Background: Historically the City of Galveston and the Park Board have worked together to perform annual beach surveys that determine the changes in the volume of sand along the beachfront. This is especially important for our engineered beaches, as this historical information is used after a storm event to show comparative proof of loss in order to file a claim with FEMA.

The basic scope of work includes conducting a Depth of Closure and Wading Depth Surveys and a Proof of Methodology Study with drone technology. The Wading Depth Surveys take place along the entire length of Galveston Island, excluding Galveston Island State Park and Jamaica Beach. The Depth of Closure surveys are conducted on the three engineered beaches only (Historic Seawall, Babe's Beach and Dellanera).

The City awarded the contract to APTIM, who will provide an update to the Committee on the surveys conducted to date.

Agenda Item: Presentation On World Ocean Day Festival Preparation From Artist Boat (Kelsey Malan, 15 Minutes)

Background: World Ocean Day is internationally celebrated annually on June 8th. The day is a reminder of the importance of the ocean and the major role it plays in our lives.

Every year, Artist Boat, a local nonprofit organization, hosts a World Ocean Day Festival in June. This year's festival will be on Saturday, June 10th, 2023, at East Beach Park. Historically, the festival was held at Stewart Beach Park, and the switch to East Beach Park was made in 2022 with positive results.

Kelsey Malan, Artist Boat's Outreach and Marketing Coordinator, will provide the committee with an update on the past exhibitors who have participated in the festival, total participation and statistics from previous years of Beautify the Bucket and World Ocean Day Festival, and Artist Boat's expected expenses thus far for the festival this year.

Agenda Item: Presentation On City of Galveston Beach Survey (APTIM Representative, 20 Minutes)

Background: The rise of COVID in 2020 resulted in millions flocking to coastal communities in search of outdoor recreation opportunities. Increase in visitation on Galveston Island had a significant impact on solid waste collections and trash left on our beaches. The Park Board launched a "Talk Trash" initiative that engaged citizens and local stakeholders to find creative solutions to not only solid waste handling, but preventative actions such as educating visitors, residents and local businesses on best waste management and reduction practices. Several initiatives came out of those discussions, with a strong emphasis on education.

In January 2021, the Park Board reached out to The Washed Ashore Project, a non-profit traveling art exhibit made entirely of marine debris collected from beaches, with the intent of bringing a handful of their sculptures to the island as part of our Blue Flag Initiative. The initial conversation led to greater opportunities for collaboration among the institutions. In July 2022, the Board of Trustees approved the first phase of several proposed for Galveston Island.

The exhibit was officially launched on Saturday, December 10th and will run through Friday, March 3rd.

Visit Galveston has also gamified the experience, making the Washed Ashore experience at Galveston an island-wide scavenger hunt. You can search for 20+ art pieces and find unique items within each sculpture. WASHED ASHORE: ART TO SAVE THE SEA

Washed Ashore - a traveling art exhibit in Galveston Island this winter - aims to educate the public about the hazards of plastic pollution in the world's waterways. These huge, awe-inspiring sculptures are constructed entirely of plastic debris washed up on America's beaches.

Have you ever seen an 8-foot-tall octopus? How about a bald eagle with a 17-foot wingspan? Meet Washed Ashore: Art to Save the Sea, a FREE, engaging family exhibit on display at 19 locations across Galveston Island from December 10, 2022, to March 5, 2023.

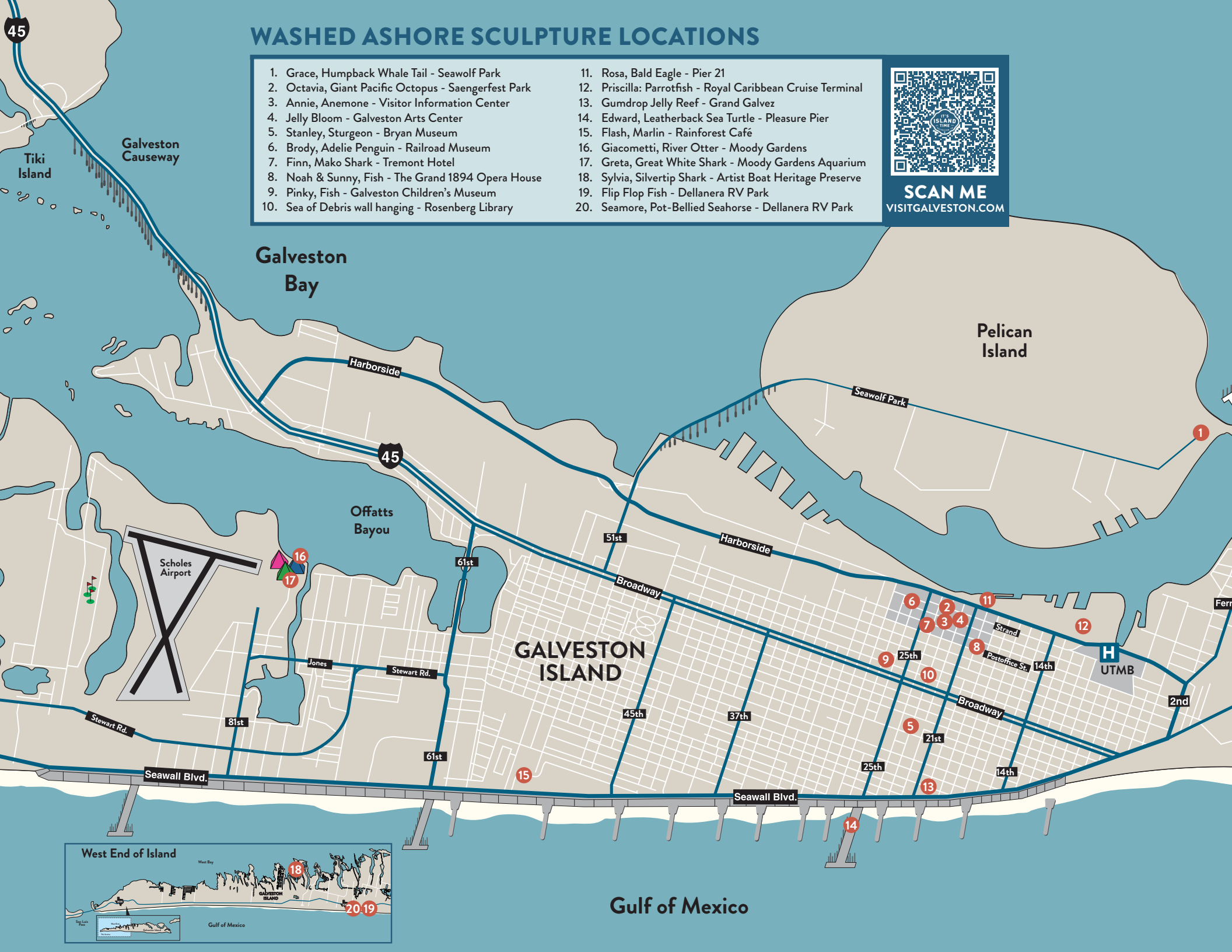

I. Call Meeting To Order

The meeting was called to order at 9:00am.

II. Pledge Of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

III. Roll Call And Declaration Of A Quorum

Roll was called and a quorum was declared.

Committee Members Present: Jason Worthen, Hal Needham, Willis Ghandi, Jen Johnson, Craig Vance, Peggy Zahler, John Mahcol, and Heidi Whitehead

IV. Conflict Of Interest Declarations

There were no conflicts of interest declared.

V. Requests To Address The Committee

Ted O'Rourke and Frank Maceo addressed the committee in regard to item XI.

Ted O'Rourke stated the following: "My name is Ted O'Rourke and I live at 1123 Church Street. I would like to start off by saying I have the utmost respect for the Park Board, the committee, and the staff. I have been on the Wharves Board for 5 years and 11 months, I've got a month left there. I know it is an honor to serve here. I want you to look at this from my position, if you had private property and if you would defend it. I think everyone in this room would do the same. They've fought wars, there is a war going on in Ukraine right now on about property rights. I am not going to go to war with anybody, I am going to handle things properly. I've got a great relationship with your Director, Kelly De Schaun, I've enjoyed working with her and she does a fantastic job. With that, I will tell you two of the most important things in the general land lease office. It specifically says on the front page, the state and the lessee hereby agree and acknowledge that the use of the term grant and or convey in no way implies that the lease or the leased premises are free of liens, encumbrance, and prior rights. The lessee is hereby put on notice that any prior grants or encumbrance may be of record and the lessee is advised to examine all records of the state and county in which the lease premises are located. I was never located or found or knew anything about to try to get my property. I would have expressed my concerns then. I did receive from the office here a copy of the survey that went out and was done and I couldn't get it open but my wife is my best friend and helper and she got it open and it says this survey is not intended to be used identify or elevate the line of vegetation or the landward boundary of the public beach. And that is in the survey itself that the Park Board immediately ran out there and surveyed my property. When they say fine print, they mean fine print. And I've got an email. Kelly and I got breakfast on July 7th, and I've got an email that says they might have an issue with my property. In that same day after the breakfast, she sent me an email and it said "It was nice meeting with you for breakfast and while we are waiting on the GLO's final decision on the public lands, I would appreciate you not authorizing any vendor of the property. I think y'all know, my vendor is the Chairman of the committee, and I chose him not because he is on the Parks Board but because he is the best vendor in Galveston. I am trying to protect my rights as a landowner. I am leaving it to my children and we have already named it Pearl Beach. We named it for them and I want to leave it

for them. It's not a big strip of beach. It's about as wide from that wall to that wall over there. I can't thank Mr. Worthen and Marlo enough for the top-notch job they have done. They are set up at 7:30, it's set up, and it's clean. The people across the street love it. And I want you to know if you were in my shoes, every one of you would have done the same. And thank you for your time."

Chair Jason Worthen reminded everyone that the committee is not allowed to comment on public comment and thanked the public for participating.

Frank Maceo was invited up for his public comment and stated the following: "Hello everybody. For the record, if Jason is the best concessionaire on the beach, I taught him everything he knows. I've been out there guys for like 30 years alright. I am Frank Thomas Maceo, and I am at 1201 Marine. I'm a former councilman here in Galveston and when I was a councilman a few years ago, me and the current Mayor had to fix problems due to claims like this. It cost the City money and time and that's money and time that we could have been putting into streets and sidewalks and curbs and things that matter to the people in Galveston. I came up to the Park Board today to inform you guys that I ain't got no beef with y'all. Alright. I am leasing privately owner uplands. Which is beachfront property encumbered by the open beaches act. And I know that. And I think you guys know that too. In 2012 my grandfather's will got passed down and we found out that the Park Board was leasing land owned by my family on 10th street. There was no contention because that land was above the highest annual tideline which is a silly line that doesn't apply to anything we do with the beaches. You guys need to remember that. I got that land back by simply telling the Park Board we owned it, we survey it, and showed exactly where it was at. During that time I was intimidated and I was threatened with lawsuits and I'm a smart kid, man, I did my research and I knew that any of these threats and intimidations weren't going to last beyond me going out and setting up on my property. On July 4th I calculated the sunset and I was out there setting up the umbrellas and chairs and I expanded Gulf Properties rights to the property down there. Guys that was 10 years ago now, Gulf Properties is still collecting rent from vendors out there that don't pay the Park Board a dime. I am here to tell you that property rights exist here in the United States of America. They exist in the state of Texas. They exist in the city of Galveston, and they exist on the beachfront here in town. I am of the position now where I am going to occupy the properties that I have a right to occupy until somebody of authority can tell me that I'm wrong. And I'm happy to receive that information because I have succeeded in this endeavor before. I was really trying to meet with Kelly this morning to try to see if she could provide the real information that determines whether the land is privately or publicly owned. And the process, I could tell you that determines if the land is privately or publicly owned, I determine that process because I went and got a lease from a private property owner and I did it 10 years ago and I just did it again. I displaced another Park Board vendor that I have known for 30 years. I've known that man out there. And I feel horrible about it but it's not the position I put anyone in. It's the position the Park Board has put itself in. And I am not talking to you people from little Frankie on the beach, I am talking to you from my experience as an elected official here in town. I think my three minutes are up if you guys even timed it, I don't know, but I am done. If you guys have any questions at all, you have my number and I am open to the proof that we don't own that property. If you guys can provide that, I am down to see it. And if it's real, it's real. And if it is not, I will continue to secure private property up and down the Seawall and will continue to displace Park Board vendors that don't have a right to be on private property."

VI. Discuss And Consider Approval Of Meeting Minutes

VII. Celebration Of BMAC Members Terming Out (Kimberly Danesi, 10 Minutes)

Kimberly Danesi presented members of the Beach Maintenance Advisory Committee terming out.

VIII. Update On Sargassum And Tropical Weather Forecast (Dr. Hal Needham, 15 Minutes)

Dr. Hal Needham provided an update on the sargassum and tropical weather forecast for the Texas coast. He also provided information on why these storms build or dissipate the way they do.

IX. Presentation Of Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Beach Cleaning And Nourished Beach Draft Budget (Bryson Fraizer, 20 Minutes)

Mr. Bryson Fraizer reviewed the FY22.23 Beach Cleaning and Nourished Beach Draft Budget with BMAC members. He explained the coversheet for both draft budgets and explained any jargon seen.

X. Discuss And Consider Approval Of The FY22.23 Beach Maintenance Advisory Work Plan (Kimberly Danesi, 10 Minutes)

Mrs. Kimberly Danesi brought forth the Work Plan for the next fiscal year to the committee for their approval.

Motion: Ms. Peggy Zahler made a motion to approve the FY22.23 BMAC Committee Work Plan.

Second: Mr. John Machol seconded the motion.

Vote: Approved (8-0)

XI. Presentation On Private Property Assertions On Babe's Beach (Kelly De Schaun, 15 Minutes)

Item XI was moved to VI due to public interest in the matter.

Mrs. Kelly De Schaun complimented the committee members for the hard work they've put into the committee and the island. Mrs. De Schaun emphasized the transparency the Park Board has always maintained and reminded the committee that the private/public land is an issue that has been grappled with in the past along the Galveston beaches and the Texas Coast. The Park Board does not own any of it. They manage the property for the City of Galveston and for the State of Texas. The Park Board is providing millions in services to the beaches. Mrs. De Schaun reminded everyone that the assertions of private property are different along the whole Texas Coast. The difference in the situation at Babe's Beach is that the land was submerged for over 20 years and built back with public funds through beach nourishments. The nourishment projects cannot continue if the land is claimed as private property as it is illegal to use public funds on private property.

XII. 2021-2022 Committee Work Plan

XIV. Announcements
